HOLY, HOLY, HOLY!

"Holy, holy, holy!" Ancient languages, like the Hebrew used in the scriptures, did not always have a way to express superlatives in one word. Isaiah could not say God was "holiest," so he used the threefold repetition of the same word. This bit of scriptural minutiae about these "three little words" that we sing at every Mass serves as a reminder that answering God's call has to be grounded in awareness of God's holiness. In Isaiah and in the Gospel passage today, we hear accounts of the revelation of God's power and might: the seraphim in the temple and the miraculous catch of fish. These are not wondrous revelations for their own sakes. They lead to a response in mission, Isaiah's "Here I am, send me!" and the disciples' leaving everything to follow Jesus. And so must our own "Holy, Holy, Holy!" lead us to Christ in the Eucharist every Sunday, and to a life following him day by day.

Lenten Regulations

All Christ's faithful are obliged by divine law, each in his or her own way, to do penance. However, so that all may be joined in a certain common practice of penance, days of penance are prescribed.

On these days, the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to fulfill their obligations more faithfully, and to deny themselves, especially by observing fast and abstinence according to the laws of the church.

Following are the Lenten penitential regulations issued for the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee:

Good Friday is a day of **fast**. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics aged 18 to 59 are bound by this law.

All Fridays of Lent are days of **abstinence**. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. Catholics aged 14 and older are bound by this law.

All of the faithful are obliged to do penance, but not all may be able to observe the above regulations of fast and abstinence because of ill health or other reasons. In addition, the faithful are urged to participate, if possible, in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during the week; in the sacrament of penance; in Lenten devotions, family prayer, and scripture reading; and in sharing of their time and resources with the less fortunate.

Visitation of the Sick

Attention Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion! Why not expand your ministry to a most rewarding and gratifying phase of serving Communion to your brothers and sisters; those who cannot attend Mass each week as we can? Volunteers are needed each Wednesday to visit the sick of St. Anne Parish, directly after morning Mass. The few of us who are visiting now, realize that we may be the only people these folks see all week long, other than doctors and nurses.
