RECONCILIATION

True reconciliation is emotional, dramatic, and cleansing. When two people meet heart to heart and work through old hurts, misunderstandings, and careless words, cleansing tears often flow and the encounter ends with an embrace that fills both with the warmth of a love too strong to fade.

The readings this weekend assure us of this healthy release that comes with reconciliation. They give us the courage to reach out to someone with whom we need to reconcile ourselves, and give us the courage to ask for forgiveness from God, too.

In the reading from Exodus, we see how God refuses again and again to give up on the Israelites. Even though they grow impatient with God and turn to false idols, God still calls them back. Luke's Gospel assures us that God rejoices when we turn away from sin. Paul's letter to Timothy encourages us, like Paul, to look back on our lives and recognize where God's patient mercy has been shown to us.

Ask Fr. George...

What is one to expect in attendance at a Mass that is celebrated 'Ad Orientem'?

Because of some ambiguity in the wording of the 'rubrics' or instructions in the Roman Missal, there remains some questions as to which way the priest should face during particular moments of the Mass; it seems that there is some discretion by the celebrating priest as to which way he could face. One of these moments occurs right at the beginning of Mass and the priest may face the people or the East when he makes the sign of the cross. Because the Penitential Rite is an appeal to God for His mercy, it is said (in either of the acceptable forms) Ad Orientem so that the priest, along with the people, ask for God's forgiveness. The Gloria and Collect or Opening Prayer too, are directed towards God so the priest remains towards the East or at least facing the altar if he is standing on the side. Of course, the readings, the Gospel and the homily are said facing the people.

The prayers of the Preparation of the Gifts are most certainly offered to God but the priest ought to face the people when he invites them to pray after the washing of the hands – "Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice....". From there, through the Canon of the Mass, (Eucharistic Prayer), and the Our Father, the priest remains in the same direction as the people, offering prayers to God on their behalf and his. At the sign of peace and at the showing of the Eucharist – "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him..." the celebrant faces the people as he is speaking to them just as he is when offering them Holy Communion. The closing prayer, again directed to God is said facing the Tabernacle with the final blessing and dismissal facing the people.

That's it. There is no change in the wording of the Mass parts, and no new gestures for the people. Is this some form of mandated change? NO, absolutely not, it is only an acceptable option that a bishop or priest may choose to use if it is his belief that it is ultimately for the good of the people. It cannot be a matter of experimentation or fad or selfish vainglory of the presider. No Mass celebration should ever be legitimately celebrated under those conditions!

There is great beauty in the Sacred Liturgy in any of its forms, whether it be in the ordinary form as many of us have experienced over the past half century, Ad Orientem, in the extraordinary form in Latin or in the form of the Divine Liturgy celebrated by the Eastern Rites of the Church. Christ died once, for all, and the re-presentation of that one holy Event may take many forms in many languages, but it is still the one, same sacrifice offered to the Father by His Son Jesus Christ. We ought never to lose sight of this and so it is important to say again that the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is about God, not the priest, not the people, not anything but God and God alone.
