DON'T BE ANXIOUS

People have, it seems, a natural penchant for misplaced emphasis on unimportant things. They can easily get caught up with what they're having for dinner or what they will wear.

Often it is a tragedy that helps people to refocus on what is really important. What I shall wear is an irrelevant question when I am facing surgery or chemotherapy. What's for dinner is immaterial to those living through grief or unemployment.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us not to worry. He doesn't say, "Don't eat. Don't cook. Don't buy clothes." He says, "Don't worry." Jesus asks us not to relinquish our responsibilities but to let go of our anxiety. Anxiety betrays a lack of trust and Jesus reminds us that "Your heavenly Father knows" all that you need (Matthew 6:32).

Lenten Regulations

All Christ's faithful are obligated by divine law, each in his or her own way, to do penance. However, so that all may be joined in a certain common practice of penance, days of penance are prescribed. On these days, the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to fulfill their obligations more faithfully, and to deny themselves, especially by observing fast and abstinence according to the laws of the church.

Following are the Lenten penitential regulations issued for the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee:

Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of **fast**. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics aged 18-59 are bound by this law.

Ash Wednesday and **All Fridays of Lent** are also days of **abstinence**. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. Catholics aged 14 and older are bound by this law.

All of the faithful are obliged to do **penance**, but not all may be able to observe the above regulations of fast and abstinence because of ill health or other reasons. In addition, the faithful are urged to participate, if possible in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during the week; in the sacrament of penance; in Lenten devotions, family prayer, and scripture reading; and in sharing of their time and resources with the less fortunate.

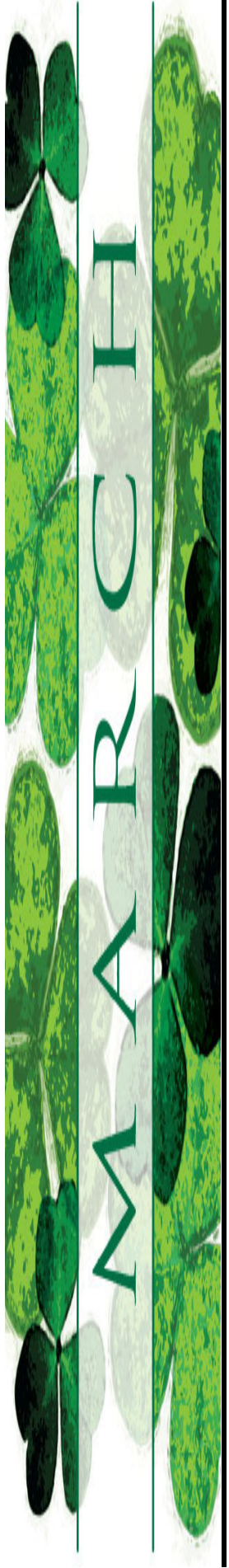
