## JESUS' MINISTRY SUMMARIZED

The story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead is the single longest story (apart from the Passion) in the Gospel of John. In it we find a summary of most of Jesus' ministry. We see his very human nature as he is moved by Martha and Mary's sorrows and as he himself weeps at the tomb of Lazarus. He is the wisdom of God's Word made flesh as he explains to his followers that the death of Lazarus will serve as a sign of the glory of God. He crowns the miracles he works in John's Gospel (which began with the most "human" miracle of making new wine at Cana's wedding) by raising Lazarus from the dead—a "preview," if you will, of his own death and resurrection to come. This portrait of Jesus reminds us, as we near the end of our Lenten journey, that he is with us, knows us, understands us in every moment of our lives. He knows the joy of our human feasting, he knows the sorrow of our weeping. As we prepare to walk with him through the days of Holy Week, we are filled with faith that—through Christ—God's glory will be with us in every moment of our lives and—with Christ—in our life everlasting.

## 1916, Angel of Fatima

The 3rd apparition of the Angel took place in autumn of 1916. He brought with him a large Host and an empty chalice that he left suspended in the air. Prostrating in front in adoration, he repeated three times this prayer:



"O Most Holy Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, I Adore Thee profoundly and I offer the Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all of the tabernacles on earth, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifference by which He Himself is offended. And by the infinite merits of His most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg the forgiveness of all poor sinners."

### Lenten Regulations

Following are the Lenten penitential regulations issued for the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee: **Good Friday** are days of **fast**. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics aged 18-59 are bound by this law.

**All Fridays of Lent** are also days of **abstinence**. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. Catholics aged 14 and older are bound by this law. All of the faithful are obliged to do **penance**, but not all may be able to observe the above regulations of fast and abstinence because of ill health or other reasons. In addition, the faithful are urged to participate, if possible in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during the week; in the sacrament of penance; in Lenten devotions, family prayer, and scripture reading; and in sharing of their time and resources with the less fortunate.

**Rice Bowls will be collected on April 9th and April 16th**
