The Angel of Peace appeared a third time to the three children, Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco at Fatima in October 1916. He gave them Communion using a Chalice and Host and also taught them the Angel's Prayer:

"O Most Holy Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Ghost. I adore Thee profoundly, and I offer the Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all of the tabernacles on earth. In reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifference by which He Himself is offended. And by the infinite merits of His most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. I beg the forgiveness of all poor sinners. (Repeat 3 times.)

To fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy, we should:

- 1) *Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter.*
- 2) *Sincerely repent of all our sins.*
- 3) *Place our complete trust in Jesus.*
- 4) *Go to Confession, preferably before that Sunday.*
- 5) *Receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast.*
- 6) *Venerate the Image of The Divine Mercy.*
- 7) *Be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf*
