## SURPRISES

Life is full of surprises, some pleasant, some not. The scriptures are filled with stories of God's surprises cropping up when they are least expected: younger children obtaining the inheritance; the lowliest being seated highest up; an itinerant preacher, killed like a criminal, exalted to eternal, heavenly glory.

Anybody who has planned a wedding or similar event knows that they are filled with opportunities for surprises. For the bridegroom in today's Gospel story, who has no direct contact with Jesus, the pleasant surprise came because somebody else paid attention and had faith in Jesus.

We may think that the point of today's familiar story of the wedding at Cana is that when we have faith in Jesus, our lives will be pleasantly changed. A Christian, however, needs to have a broader perspective and realize that to have faith in Christ means that somebody's life—not necessarily our own—will be surprised for the better.

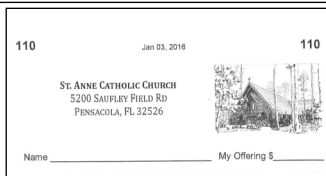

## **Special Second Collection Next Weekend Letter from the Bishop's Office**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Severe weather, in the form of violent storms, tornados and floods, have impacted states in the South and Midwest regions of our country. Additional major flooding is expected over the next several weeks as rivers and tributaries continue to rise. As that happens and the weather continues to grow colder, communities might very well have to contend with freezing and icing of their initial flood damage. And while the poor are the hardest hit by these conditions, many will have vast unmet needs.

Unfortunately, the traditional "storm seasons" seem to have given way to much more unpredictable weather and natural disasters seem to be increasingly commonplace. As we often do in these situations, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishop is asking that we take up a special collection for the humanitarian and Church needs from these storms. In anticipation of more domestic disasters awaiting us this year, this special appeal is for the ongoing domestic disasters which began in December 2015 and for those to come in 2016.

The funds collected in this one-time special appeal for the 2015-2016 storms and other natural disasters will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA, the official domestic relief agency of the U.S. Catholic Church, as it and it's member agencies respond to immediate emergency needs for such necessities as water, food, shelter, and medical care, as well as to the long term need to rebuild and recover after widespread destruction, and to the USCCB for pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church.

We join with our Holy Father who invited everyone "to pray for the victims of the calamities which in these days have befallen the United States, Great Britain, and South America... May the Lord give comfort to all these peoples and may fraternal solidarity aid them in their need."

Knowing your great generosity in the past, I thank you in advance for your response as our brothers and sisters urgently struggle to rebuild their lives and cling to the hope their faith gives them.
