Lenten Regulations

All Christ's faithful are obliged by divine law, each in his or her own way, to do penance. However, so that all may be joined in a certain common practice of penance, days of penance are prescribed.

On these days, the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to fulfill their obligations more faithfully, and to deny themselves, especially by observing fast and abstinence according to the laws of the church.

Following are the Lenten penitential regulations issued for the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee:

Good Friday is a day of ***fast***. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics aged 18 to 59 are bound by this law.

All Fridays of Lent are days of ***abstinence***. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. Catholics aged 14 and older are bound by this law.

All of the faithful are obliged to do penance, but not all may be able to observe the above regulations of fast and abstinence because of ill health or other reasons. In addition, the faithful are urged to participate, if possible, in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during the week; in the sacrament of penance; in Lenten devotions, family prayer, and scripture reading; and in sharing of their time and resources with the less fortunate.
