OUR RESPONSIBILITY FOR OTHERS

The Second Vatican Council has called us to envision the Church as the people of God. As a community of believers we are responsible for our brothers and sisters, their salvation, their journey of faith, their physical well-being. Many of the documents of Vatican II and volumes of work since the mid-1960s give us advice, guidelines, and encouragement to take care of one another: the poor, the elderly, the unborn, the broken, the infirm.

Because Vatican II is part of our recent history—indeed many of us were already born—this may strike us as a new and revolutionary idea. But today's readings show us the agelessness of the issue of social justice. Eight hundred years before Christ was born, Amos warned the wealthy not to cheat the poor. In Paul's first letter to Timothy, he encourages all prayers to be for all people; and finally, the Gospel urges the wise use of money.

ABOUT CATHOLIC SCOUTING

A ministry of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee and the diocesan Office of Youth Ministry, the mission of the **Diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting** is to promote the use of youth serving programs including Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Girls Scouts, American Heritage Girls, Trail Life USA, and Camp Fire as Catholic youth ministry throughout the diocese.

To support inclusion of the Catholic faith in these programs, Bishop Gregory Parkes annually celebrates a Scout Mass (also known as the "Green Mass") in the eastern and western ends of the diocese to award religious emblems to youth who have participated and completed the program requirements. The ultimate goal of these religious recognitions is to help foster discipleship among our Catholic youth:

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

The National Catholic Committee on Scouting (NCCS) has established four religious emblems for Catholic youth, two for boys of Cub Scouting age and two for older youth in Boy Scouts or a Venturing Crew:

- Light of Christ** Designed for 6-7 year old (Tiger or Wolf) Cub Scouts
Parvuli Dei Designed for 8-10 year old (Bear or Webelos) Cub Scouts
Ad Altare Dei Designed for 11-17 year old youth, but open to all Boy Scouts and Venturing Crew members
Pope Pius XII Designed for Boy Scouts and Venturing Crew members 18 years old and older

GIRL SCOUTS OF THE USA, AMERICAN HERITAGE GIRLS, and CAMP FIRE

Girl Scouts, American Heritage Girls, and Camp Fire use the religious emblems programs developed by the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry (www.nfcym.org), which has established five religious emblems for girls:

- God Is Love*** Designed for girls in K-1st grade
Family of God Designed for girls in grades 2-3
I Live My Faith Designed for girls in grades 4-6
Mary, the First Disciple Designed for girls in grades 7-10
The Spirit Alive Designed for girls in grades 11-12
