DIVINE WISDOM

The Lord's message, through Moses, was to "take no revenge and cherish no grudge . . . love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18). We might think, "Great in theory, but not always realistic!"

Then Jesus in today's Gospel goes even further. Take a slap in the face and then turn the other cheek? Treat enemies the same as friends? Again, we're tempted to think that those are nice ideals, but not very practical in the "real world."

Paul echoes Jesus when he tells the Corinthians that what passes for human wisdom is absurdity to God. Divine wisdom casts sunshine on the good and the bad, showers rain on the honest and the dishonest—without distinction. We must examine our wisdom and common sense to see how they compare to the wisdom of God, and make adjustments accordingly.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. GEORGE

About 1 ½ years ago we introduced a debt reduction plan to speed up the payoff of the Family Life Center mortgage, which has had a long, tumultuous history. The hope at that time was that 400 families would pledge \$800 a year for 3 years and that would completely pay down the debt. We had roughly 100 people make pledges from anywhere from \$200 to \$1200/yr which has greatly reduced the principle. **THANK YOU!** However, we still have a long ways to go since only 25% of the necessary 400 made pledges. If you were not able to make a pledge back then but can do so now, or if you are new to the parish and want to help free from our staggering debt, please consider completing the attached pledge and let your support begin as you are able. Any funds pledged are **ALL** put towards the principle of the loan and cannot and will not be used for any other purpose!

We have come a long way with a few, imagine how much more we can do with your help too!!

Feast of the Chair of St. Peter the Apostle

February 22 is a special day on the Catholic Church's Calendar. It is the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter the Apostle. Why do you think we would celebrate a Feast Day about a chair?

First of all, do you know who Saint Peter was? He was one of Jesus' apostles, and he was also the very first Pope. The Pope is the leader of all the Catholics in the world!

As for "the Chair"....the ancient Latin word for the chair that important officials sat in is "cathedra." This is the word the Catholic Church uses for the Bishop's chair. The Pope is the Bishop of Rome. But every diocese has a bishop. And the church where the Bishop's chair is located in each diocese is called the "cathedral" church of that diocese, because of the bishop's chair – the "cathedra." Have you been to the Cathedral in our diocese? (Sacred Heart)

The Chair of Saint Peter the Apostle is a symbol of the authority that Jesus gave to Saint Peter to lead the Church. Saint Peter is often pictured holding keys, another symbol of his leadership and authority. In the Bible (Matthew 16:18-19), Jesus says he is giving the keys of the kingdom of heaven to Peter.

Saint Peter was a martyr. That means that he was put to death for witnessing to his faith. When Saint Peter died, the Church community chose a new Pope. And when that Pope died, they chose yet another Pope. Since the time of Saint Peter, we have had 266 Popes!
