100 years ago in Fatima.....

On May 13, 1917 at the Cova da Iria pasture in Fatima, Portugal, Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco saw a brilliant light, then a beautiful Lady. She asked if they wished to endure suffering in reparation for sins, and they said yes (their families and neighbors would mock them.) She told them to pray the rosary every day for peace (to end World War I), and to make sacrifices for sinners (they would give their lunches to beggar children). Overwhelmed by her light, they prayed the Eucharistic Prayer:

"Do not be afraid, I will not harm you. I am from heaven."
